Eligibility for Entry Ban Exemption under the Carefree COVID-19 Vaccination Program

April 28, 2022

Eligibility for applying for exemption of entry ban under the Carefree COVID-19 Vaccination Program

Overstayers or undocumented migrant workers who got vaccinated for at least 1 dose after the start of the program on December 3, 2021, and surrendered to a law enforcement agency (police or the NIA) and paid administrative penalty may apply to the NIA for exemption of entry ban.

The resumption day of international flights is set to be April 29, 2022

In light of the restart of international flights to countries such as Vietnam beginning in January, 2022; the NIA sets April 29, 2022, as the official date which international flights resume to their regular operation.

If you surrendered on or before April 29, 2022:

You may be eligible for entry ban exemption depending on the date your leave Taiwan, which must not be later than October 29, 2022. (6 months after regular international flights resumption)

If you surrendered after April 29, 2022:

You may be eligible for entry ban exemption under the premise that you leave Taiwan within 40 days after the day you surrendered.

Required documents

COVID-19 Vaccination Record (the yellow card), flight booking record, and other documents needed for surrendering such as passport or travel documents.
